





- Very few preservation policies




The bottom-up actions

- Local actions taken since the 90s; more and more common since 2010s.
- Projects are run by individuals, associations or local authorities - rarely with national or EU support
 - To preserve local memory of the war
 - To teach about the war
 - To develop tourism
 - To protect the bats
